Messenger: Janawicz is named PBA50 Player of the Year

Last month the PBA announced that John Janawicz was PBA50 of the year. He has won five PBA50 titles. He has dominated the PBA50 Majors. Janawicz has made a name on the PBA50 Tour winning 4 out of 5 PBA50 Majors. This season Janawicz won two PBA50 Majors, one was the PBA Senior US Open and the other one was the PBA50 Bud Moore Players Championship. He would go on to win three more titles to add for his dominating PBA50 Tour season. He joins such PBA greats as Parker Bohn III, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete Weber, Norm Duke, Wayne Webb and Mark Roth.

"Those are some legends of the game there," Janawicz said. "To be in that class of player, it's quite an honor. I'm very grateful and very humbled to be mentioned in the same breath as those guys."

In his eight stepladder finals appearances, Janawicz compiled the following stats:

- 16-3 record (5-0 in championship matches)
- 84.21% win percentage
- 243.21 average (212.89 opponent average)
- 2 games < 200
- 15 games > 230
- 6 games > 260

Janawicz has become a superstar on the PBA50 Tour with seven PBA50 Tour titles four of which are PBA50 Majors.

Spare Column: PBA50 Awards

Last month, the PBA announced the winners of the PBA50 awards including PBA50 Rookie of the Year, PBA60 Player of the Year, and the Sportsmanship award winner. Randy Weiss was awarded the PBA50 Player of the year after leading in the point standings with a total of 12,515, four top-10 finishes and a third place finish in the USBC Senior Masters. His average of 216.43 was achieved across 216 games this season. "You only get one chance at something like this, so to come away with it is pretty special and

something I'll never forget," Weiss said

Another winner on the PBA50 Tour was the Greatest of All Time Walter Ray Williams Jr. Once again he was the PBA60 Player of the Year. Walter Ray Williams has won countless Player of the Year honors. Williams notched two runner-up finishes this season, including the PBA60 Tristan's T.A.P.S. Memorial Open, five top-10 finishes and \$27,050 in earnings in his 17 events. He averaged 217.08 across 345 games. Walter Ray Williams Jr. has proven again to be in the elite of the PBA Hall of Fame.

"I like to compete, but getting any kind of award is obviously nice," Walter commented.

The Dick Weber Sportsmanship award went to Don Hogue of Akron, Ohio. The nominees had to compete in fifty percent of the PBA50 Tour schedule.


"I met Dick Weber and to be anything like him is an unbelievable honor," Hogue said. Hogue also added that "I just try to be myself. It's nice that people think I'm a nice guy,"

Hogue's highest finish was at the Senior US Open where he finished tenth.

Steve Badovinac, Dave Johnson, Jeff Johnson (the 2022 recipient of this award) and Jack Jurek also received nominations.





Editorial-A Bowlologist View of Bowling

Bowling is indeed a sport. Eleven strikes down, ten pins up, one ball to go. The ball gets to the 45 foot mark, makes a big left hand hook, smashes the pocket, ten in the pit. What a thrill! Fellow bowlers and bowling fans are congratulating the bowler.

The distance from the foul line to the head pin is 60 feet with the width of the lane being 39 inches. The bowler has 15 feet from the back of the approach to the foul line. These are all of the factors that a bowler has to do in each frame to make the best shot possible.

A Bowlologist studies bowling and all of the factors that a bowler goes through. The Bowlologist can make a distinction between a good bowler and a great bowler. A Bowlologist is able to analyze what a bowler is doing wrong in any given game or match. A Bowlologist also knows why the scoring is so high or so low. A Bowlologist can describe what is happening during a bowling competition.

Spare Column— PBA Elite League Strike Derby

Jesper Svensson won the PBA Elite League Derby by defeating 2024 Mark Roth MVP, Andrew Anderson in a close match 12-11. Anderson chose to bowl first which gave Jesper a 2 minute break. Jesper took the win with a last second strike. Anderson was trying to dominate the PBA Elite League Series by winning the Strike Derby and claiming all the League events, but he fell a little bit short.

"I'm not really the best at this thing," said Svensson, "I feel like I'm not fast enough. I don't get enough shots in. But I got better as we went."

The 2024 Elite League Strike Derby featured bowlers who the PBA fans voted for during the season. They were able to vote for their favorite from each league team. The PBA fanbase selected Packy Hanrahan, Jason Belmonte, Andrew Anderson, EJ Tackett, Kyle Troup and Jesper Svensson. Chris Via and Arturo Quintero were selected as wild cards by the PBA Commissioner.

Reigning PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett was unfortunately eliminated in the first round even though he had a spectacular 13 strikes. Anderson was able to defeat Tackett in the roll-off X-9. Also in the first round, Jesper had a slow start with a 6-4 win over Packy Hanrahan. Jason Belmonte squashed Kyle Troup 10-6, but in the semi-final he was beaten by Jesper 10-9.
